As a member of AFBI staff you have high quality electronic and print resources and a pro-active library service available to you. You can access your **AFBI Library online** at www.afbilib.qub.ac.uk and on two main sites at Newforge and Stormont.

Joining the Library

Current AFBI staff, authorised by their Heads of Division, are entitled to join the Library. Please ask for a registration form at any branch or download a form from: **AFBI Library Online > Library services > membership** and send it to your nearest AFBI library.

Authentication and access to electronic resources

A username and password will be given to you when you receive your library card. This will enable you to access all AFBI Library electronic resources from anywhere with an internet connection, either on your PC or mobile device.

Use the Library catalogue **Search@AFBILib** to search for articles in journals or do a more general topic search. Enter an article title or a keyword from the AFBI Library Online homepage, then simply refine your search from the results page.

Document delivery

Use this service to obtain material not available in your local AFBI Library. Use [New Research Alert](#) on the library catalogue or [AFBI CONNECT](#) when searching databases. Journal articles can now be delivered directly to your desktop using the British Library DRM Lite.

Databases

For more specialised searching use one of the databases hosted on the Web of Science platform. Find these on **AFBI Library Online > Databases.**

Managing your references

The library provides support for Endnote. Training sessions are organised throughout the year and one-to-one and small group training are also available.

TRAINING AND SUPPORT

All members of the library can take advantage of the free library training and support.

We can arrange training on an individual basis at the Library, or in groups at a location convenient to you. The training can be tailored to meet your needs, such as:-

- An overview of the AFBI Library Online website and library services
